RESOLUTION: RESOLVED, That the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Topeka, Kansas, deem it necessary for the best interests of said city that Adams Street from the south line of Fifth Street to the south line of Seventh Street in said city, be graded, curbed with combined curb and gutter, and paved sixty feet wide with eighteen per cent vitrified blocks on a five inch concrete base with gravel filler.

LEGAL: (First published in The Topeka State Journal, January 6, 1915.) Kansas State Board of Health. Topeka, Kansas. At a regular meeting of the Kansas State Board of Health, held at Topeka, Kansas, December 18th, 1914, at which a quorum was present, the following amendments were unanimously adopted for the regulation of the Kansas Food and Drug Law, and ordered to be printed in the official state paper:
