

NONPARTY LINES

Appropriation Fight Not a Matter of Politics Only. Democrats and Republicans Mix Votes in the Fight. DOESN'T APPEAR PORK BARREL. Senate Methods Not From Districts With Institutions. Analysis of Budget Support in the Upper House of Session.

Political lines are not keeping the house and senate apart in the appropriation fight which has blocked adjournment and attracted state wide attention. The record of votes shows that in the senate where the fat appropriation bills originated that the measures would have been badly beaten except for Republican votes. At no time in the fight has a strictly party line been drawn in the senate. In the house, however, a majority of the Democrats have voted for the senate bills, while the Republicans and Progressives have in the main supported their own committee.

Numerous statements and published articles in the last couple of weeks have given the impression that the high appropriations in the senate were due entirely to a Democratic organization to boost taxes. On the other hand, the credit for low appropriations was given house Republicans. Yet the records of almost every fight show house Democrats and Progressive voting with the Republicans. Had the administration been able to have held the same organization in the senate, it would have gained enough Democratic votes to put through the house bills and the battle would now be over.

There are just 21 Democrats in the senate. It requires 21 votes to pass any bill through that branch of the legislature. If a strict party line is drawn and one Democrat deserts and goes to a solid Republican vote, the organization, the vote is tied and W. Y. Morgan, lieutenant governor and a Republican casts the deciding vote. Where two or more Democrats desert in a party fight, and the opposition holds its line, the Democrats are beaten.

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on the big educational appropriations—see record of senate bill No. 817—six Democrats voted against the senate appropriations. That left but fifteen Democrats—six short of a constitutional majority. While the five Democrats opposed the senate bills for state schools, 12 Republicans and Progressives voted for the bills. And as against the record of 23 Republicans and Progressives voting for the senate bills, the record shows that but seven opposed the measure on final roll call. The vote was 27 ayes, 13 nays. Senator Fairley was absent and not voting. Of the 21 senate Democrats, Bowman, Gray, King, Meek, Nighswonger and Williams voted against the new buildings at the state schools. To offset the loss of these six votes, the following Republicans and Progressives voted for the bill: Denton, Huffman, Mahin, Nixon, Overfield, Porter, Price of Clark, Stillings, Trott, Troutman, and Wolf.

DR. GUILD WILL GO

Popular Topeka Pastor Will Leave for New York. City Loses One of Her Best Citizens and Boosters.

Dr. Roy E. Guild, pastor of the Central Congregational church, at the close of the Sunday morning church services announced his resignation and the fact that he has accepted an offer to become secretary of the Federation of the Churches in Christ with headquarters in New York City. Dr. Guild was offered this position some time ago, as was announced in the State Journal. The resignation will become effective April 15. It will be acted upon by the trustees Thursday night.

Dr. Guild is what might be termed a "mixer." There is no more popular preacher in Topeka today. He is a member of the board of directors of the Topeka Commercial club and a member of the Topeka Rotary club. He has unusual ability as an organizer. Since he accepted the pastorate of the Central church three years ago four hundred persons have been added to the membership list. The church has grown rapidly in strength. Dr. Guild has been carrying out the excellent work started by Dr. Charles M. Sheldon of world fame, the first pastor of the church.

FIGHT EASTER MORN.


