

OPEN TO MASONS

Shriners' Special to the Coast Is Not Limited.

Will Leave Topeka for the West July 6.

MARSHALL'S BAND WILL GO

If Money Can Be Raised to Defray the Expense.

Will Be at Frisco Exposition on Kansas Day.

The itinerary of the Kansas Shrine special to the Pacific coast leaving Topeka July 6 and returning three weeks later has been announced. From Topeka to Denver the train will go on the Santa Fe. From Denver to Ogden, Utah, on the Union Pacific. A one day side trip to Salt Lake City will be taken on the Oregon Short Line. From Ogden to Portland, Oregon the Oregon Short Line also will be followed. To Seattle, Washington and back to Portland the Shriner special will be routed on the Oregon, Washington Railroad and Navigation line. South to San Francisco the Kansans will travel on the Southern Pacific. From Frisco to Los Angeles and San Diego, then east to Colorado Springs on the way home the Shrine special will follow the Santa Fe lines. The trip to Topeka from Colorado Springs will be on the Rock Island. Marshall's band will be carried provided special funds are forthcoming to defray expenses. Although the definite schedule has not been arranged, it is known that the Shriners will be at the San Francisco fair on Kansas Day, July 19. In all probability, Abdallah temple will be joined by Isis temple which includes Shrinedom of the northwest

quarter of the state, to make the special a go. With the famous Marshall's Military band as the chief attraction and the patrols of the two temples in addition, stops will be made at the chief cities enroute. One day will be spent at Denver and another at Salt Lake City. The Shrine Imperial Council at Seattle the week of July 12 will be a gala one for the tourists as will the following ten days further south at the fairs at San Francisco where a three or four day stop will be made and at San Diego where it is planned to stay two days.

Not Limited to Shriners. An Abdallah Shrine committee planning the special train has announced that the trip will not be limited to Shriners and their families alone. Any Masons will be welcome to join for vacation jaunts. Arrangements have been made so that the railroad fare for the entire way will be only \$67.50. The special will carry both standard Pullman sleepers and tourist sleepers. Tourist accommodations will be available at about \$14 or slightly more than \$10 for the entire traveling cost. The cost of the standard Pullman will be about \$28. In addition to the sleeping cars the special will carry an observation car, a chair car and baggage cars.

The Topeka Abdallah Shriners' club is planning to do its part to make the trip a success. On the week of May 24 the Wortham shows 22 different attractions—will show at the fair grounds under the auspices of the club. Included in the committee in charge of the festival are A. B. C. 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
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
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
