MUTUALIZE RISK FIRM.

Dupont to Offer Option on Immense Equitable Holdings.

New York, June 14.—Complete mutualization of the Equitable Life Assurance society is the plan of General Coleman Dupont, who has just bought the majority holdings of the stock of the society from J. P. Morgan.

Reports that this is the purpose of the new owners were confirmed today by his representative here, Hugh McAtamney, who said that General Dupont would soon offer policyholders a two or three year option on the stock.

What the terms of the offer will be has not yet been disclosed, but it is believed General Dupont, who now holds 502 shares, will let it go for what he paid for it, plus interest for the time the stock is in his hands.

That price has not been disclosed, but is believed to be well upwards of \$3,000,000.

Mr. McAtamney said that General Dupont probably would issue a statement before the end of the week.

At the regular annual meeting of the Kansas State Board of Health, held at the above date and place, the following rules and regulations were unanimously adopted by the State Board of Health under the provision of Chapter 347, Laws of 1915, relating to the collection and analysis of waters supplied to the public in this state, and I hereby certify that these regulations are a correct copy of those adopted by said Board. (Signed) [Seal.] S. J. CHURCHMAN, M. D., Secretary, Kansas State Board of Health.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE COLLECTION OF SAMPLES AND ANALYSIS OF WATER.

Section 1. That the State Board of Health shall make and publish, in the official state paper, rules and regulations for the collection of samples and analysis of water, either natural or treated, furnished by municipalities, corporations, companies or individuals to the public, and shall be the fees for any services rendered under said rules and regulations to cover the cost of the services, which fees shall be approved by the State Board of Administration before they become operative.

Sec. 2. The analysis of all waters required in the rules and regulations shall be made at the Water and Sewage Laboratory of the State Board of Health at the University of Kansas, and the fees collected under the provisions of this act shall be turned into the state treasury for the benefit of said laboratory of the University of Kansas.

Sec. 3. That every corporation, railway, common carrier, company or individual that shall fail to comply with the rules and regulations of the State Board of Health under this act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$500.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its publication in the official state paper.

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING COLLECTION OF SAMPLES AND ANALYSIS OF WATER FROM CITY SUPPLIES FURNISHING GROUND WATER TO THE PUBLIC.

1. A complete sanitary inspection of city supplies furnishing ground water shall be made by a representative of the Division of Water and Sewage of the State Board of Health at least once each year and for analysis, the samples collected shall be subjected to a complete analysis at the Water and Sewage Laboratory of the State Board of Health, upon receipts of container from the city officials, water works or other persons authorized by the Secretary of the State Board of Health, within one week from date of receipt.

2. Results of these analyses with any pertinent remarks and advice shall be reported to the person whose name is signed on the information blank and shall be the property of the State Board of Health.

3. As many additional analyses shall be made as may be deemed necessary by the Engineer of the State Board of Health to show the quality of proposed city supplies shall be made upon request to the Water and Sewage Division of the State Board of Health.

4. Fees for services rendered under these rules and regulations shall be payable July first of each year to the Director of the Water and Sewage Laboratory of the State Board of Health at the University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas.

5. Reports of analysis shall be made to the person signing the information blank and permits shall be issued by the Secretary of the State Board of Health.

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING COLLECTION OF SAMPLES AND ANALYSIS OF WATER SUPPLIED TO THE PUBLIC BY COMMON CARRIERS.

1. Sanitary inspections of the sources of supply and methods of handling water furnished by common carriers to the public within the state, shall be made twice annually by a representative of the Division of Water and Sewage of the State Board of Health.

2. Samples shall be collected at the time of inspection from the sources of supply and from the place where trains are watered. Samples so collected shall be subjected to complete analysis in the Water and Sewage Laboratory of the State Board of Health in accordance with the standard adopted by the United States Treasury Department for testing water supplied to the public by common carriers in interstate commerce.

3. Results of these analyses shall be reported to the proper railroad official, to the State Board of Health, to the Surgeon General of the United States Public Health Service.

4. Railroads and common carriers furnished by common carriers to passengers in the State does not meet the requirements of the standard of the treasury department and repairs or improvements on the supply are made with the approval of the Division of Water and Sewage of the State Board of Health, one additional analysis shall be made without cost to the common carrier.

5. Railroads and common carriers shall file with the Water Sewage Laboratory of the State Board of Health a list of all places in the State where passenger trains are furnished with water for drinking purposes and the said laboratory shall be notified at once in case any change is made in the source of supply or in the method of handling the water.

6. The fee for the services rendered under these rules and regulations pertaining to the collection and analysis of water from city supplies shall be \$30.00 annually for each source of supply from which water is furnished to be used by passengers.

7. The fee for analysis shall be \$30.00 annually for each source of supply from which water is furnished to be used by passengers.

8. In case a person, company, corporation, institution or municipality believes that the water supplied to the public is not pure and wholesome, it shall be the duty of the State Board of Health to investigate the same and to take such action as may be necessary to protect the public health.

9. Samples shall be collected weekly, according to directions of the Water and Sewage Laboratory, by city officials, water works officials or other persons authorized by the Secretary of the State Board of Health from the raw and finished treated water and sent to said laboratory for analysis in containers furnished.
