An Appeal to Edison. "What I want to ask is if you would be willing, as a sacrifice to your own country, to act as adviser to this board, to take such things as seem to you to be of value, and to investigate, and to present, equipped to investigate, and to use your own magnificent facilities in such investigation, if you feel in worth your while to do so, we will endeavor not to bother you with trivial matters, as we probably will have sufficient facilities to handle such matters as they come up. This is a great deal to ask and I, unfortunately, have nothing but the thanks of the navy, and, I think, of the world, to offer you, together with the feeling of service to your country that you will have, to offer you by way of recompense; yet, so much do we honor you for your patriotism and your unselfish loyalty to your country's interests that I feel justified in making this request."

Edison Gladly Accepts. In announcing that he would gladly accept Secretary Daniels' invitation, Mr. Edison said he believed the proposal so important that it should be attended to now at the earliest opportunity. The war in Europe was bringing before the public the importance of encouraging and developing ideas and inventions of Americans—especially of officers and men of the army and navy.

The United States is far behind in these matters," said Mr. Edison. "I am a coal miner, honored by my fellow workers with years of faith. My devotion will stand even this, the acid test for the maintenance of their principles, while others are being put to awaken others to the wrongs in our world calling as definitely today as in time past for a remedy."

In denying the motion for a new trial, Judge Hillier reviewed each separate contention of the applicant and stated at the conclusion of his ruling that in his judgment there was not sufficient ground for a retrial of the case.
