Rosina McSimms, May Stanford and John Glover are being held by the police for investigation in connection with the robbery.

In this way he accounts for the fact that he had 21 \$100 bills in his wallet when he went into the bottoms. The robbery took place near the Shawnee mills at Third street and Kansas avenue.

SCIENCE OF IRRIGATION

J. M. Case of Abilene Responds to Greetings at Stockton, Cal.

Stockton, Cal., Sept. 13.—The Twenty-Second International Irrigation congress opened here today with a program which foreshadowed perhaps as much attention to the immediate welfare of the man who works irrigation land as to the method by which he would do it. Today's program followed the address of welcome by Governor Johnson of California and the response by President J. M. Case of Abilene, Kan.

knowledge of the country to be developed.

"Railroads invariably precede development," Mr. McCormick declared. He described the pioneering of the Southern Pacific across Arizona and into the Imperial valley in California. Southern Pacific engineers, he said, were the men who put water on the Coachella valley in the Colorado desert by boring artesian wells, and who found there the possibilities of growing in this country the commercial date.

BACKED BY CURTIS

Kansas Senator Endorses Action to Relieve Russian Jews.

A mass meeting will be held at the Auditorium Sunday afternoon by the Jewish relief commission for the purpose of laying before the people of Topeka the deplorable condition of the Jews in Russia. Governor Arthur Capper, Senator Charles Curtis and E. Billikopf, president of the Jewish alliance of Kansas City, will speak. "The Jews of Russia, on account of the war, are said to be in extreme want and measures will be taken immediately to send relief to them. Besides keeping them from starving an effort will be made to aid them in securing equal rights in Russia. Following is a letter from Senator Curtis to Ike Gilberg, the Topeka tailor: My Dear Mr. Gilberg:

Today the Jews of Russia, on account of the war conditions, are suffering for food and clothing and are in great despair and need the help of the people of the United States. This is not a time for words but is a time for action by those who are able to assist and if people of this country regardless of creed, will respond quickly, a long suffering and poverty-stricken people will be greatly relieved. To aid the Jews in Russia at this time will not only save thousands of them from starving but will aid them in their efforts to secure equal rights. In this effort they will surely have the aid, sympathy and best wishes of all of the people of the United States, where the people stand for equal rights.
