GIRLS WON'T TELL IT ALL DEPENDS

Miss Bresette Finds Trouble in Obtaining Information.

Wage Earners Are Afraid of Losing Their Jobs.

Members of the Kansas wage commission have bumped against a stone wall. The Kansas working girl is refusing to tell of her troubles under oath...

While the members of the commission can gather barrels of information about needed regulation, the working girls hesitate to step out in the open...

Just now Miss Lenna Bresette, state factory inspector and secretary of the wage commission, is trying to solve the problem. When blanks are sent to the clerks and factory girls asking several dozen questions about their work and hours of employment...

"How are we to get this information if the girls won't tell us?" asked Miss Bresette, who for three seconds laid aside her smiles and threatened to cry. "The employers are kind to us. Very. When I visit a store or shop or factory, I am received cordially. I am taken to a place as far as I like and the place over until I get tired. But the real inside facts are the facts the working girls themselves can give."

When the new commission to regulate conditions among working girls was created, several hundred letters came from girls in the larger towns of the state. These letters told of long hours and conditions that needed regulating. The commission took a deep breath and prepared for a long campaign. They went out to get the information. Presto. The information wasn't there. The working girls closed up like a society queen in a breach of promise suit.

"Some of them are afraid they will lose their positions if they give out information," said Miss Bresette. "I simply don't know what to do."

SCHOOL HOUSE MODEL

One Has Been Erected in Corridor of the State House.

A complete rural school house has been erected in the west corridor of the state capitol building as a part of the Kansas State Normal's rural school exhibit.

"I have built here a model school house," said Professor Culter in explaining its construction. "It should be adopted as a plan in every county in Kansas. It is a cottage in plan, with stucco walls, that are far more enduring than clapboards. It is built with an eye for attractiveness as well as use. The rooms are specially arranged so that all the light will come over the left shoulder. The sanitation and heating are cared for by special apparatus for rural schools."

POLITICS HIT A CHURCH

Sunday School Teacher and Superintendent Row; Class on Strike.

Chicago, Nov. 12.—Fifty young men, members of Adolph E. Rouland's Sunday school class in the First Methodist church of Maywood, declared themselves on strike Thursday as a result of Rouland's resignation, which followed, he said, political differences with J. L. Hanley, superintendent of the Sunday school. Hanley supports the civil welfare party and Rouland is identified with the good government league. Contentions arose, according to Rouland, when Hanley accused him of using members of his Sunday school class to add strength to his political organization. Hanley said he had no comment to make on Rouland's resignation.

F. & M. AT ELLSWORTH

Citizen of That Locality Reported Attacked by the Disease.

The state board of health will conduct a special investigation of a report of foot and mouth disease near Ellsworth. According to a report received in Topeka, a ranchman near Ellsworth contracted the dread disease.

It is not known whether a correct diagnosis of the case has been made, although the state department will at once charge of the inquiry. Dr. Alfred O'Donnell of Ellsworth has denied that the case shows definite evidences of foot and mouth disease. He refused to give the patient's name.

GIVE MURDER VERDICT

Slayer of Wichita Detective Found Guilty in First Degree.

Wichita, Nov. 12.—Auda M. Caplinger, 35 years old, was today found guilty of murder in the first degree for shooting and killing William L. Humphries, a Wichita detective, last February. Humphries was attempting to arrest Caplinger.

IT ALL DEPENDS

Bull Moose Is Pursuing a Policy of Watchful Waiting.

Wants to See What Elephant and Donkey Do.

HENRY ALLEN ON THE OUTLOOK

Party in Kansas Will Follow the National Leaders.

Hiram Johnson a Likely Man for Presidential Nomination.

Whether the Progressives put a national ticket in the field in 1916 depends upon the action of the Republican and Democratic parties during the next few months, according to Henry J. Allen of Wichita. With a Bull Moose national ticket, Kansas Moozers would doubtless get behind the movement with a state ticket, the Wichita editor believes.

Allen is sanguine as to the future of politics. He sees many good, strong and true men in the Republican party. He sees an element of virtue in Democracy. If one of the old parties were to step up a real fight and flourish flirtation with the Progressives, Allen might approve an amalgamation if he thought the proposals were genuine and sincere.

"Progressives in the nation are watching the actions of the Republican and Democratic parties more closely than the parties make us to be," Allen said in discussing possibilities of the next presidential campaign. "It depends on the records these parties make as to whether the Bull Moose will again be in the field."

All of which might be taken by some politicians as an indication that Allen is looking for someone to slip him an olive branch and a political harbor of refuge. But Allen insists that the Progressives are still alive and doing business as a going concern.

Massachusetts Vote Meant Little. "The vote in Massachusetts really didn't mean what might be surmised from the face of things and the Progressives are still strong," Allen argued. "They are, however, more independent in their political beliefs than the old time politicians and they want to see their policies rather than their party win."

With a Progressive national ticket in the field, Allen anticipates that Hiram Johnson, governor of California, would be the third party nominee for the presidency. "I don't pretend to predict what Roosevelt will do in the next campaign," Allen said when asked for an opinion as to the colonel's political future. "Johnson, however, would probably be the logical man for the presidential nomination if a fight were made."

"Whether there is a Progressive ticket in Kansas depends entirely on whether a national ticket is nominated. With candidates for president and vice president, the Progressives would most certainly nominate a state ticket."

As to the men who might be in the front rank of the third party fight in Kansas next year or the possible nominees of the party in the state, Allen declines to venture a guess.

"What will Murdock do?" Allen was asked.

"Victor is still a Progressive," said Allen, "and he will work any place they want to use him."

Allen was active in the suffrage campaigns in New York and Massachusetts. He made a number of speeches for the women, but even his oratory failed to save the day.

"I shudder to think what would have happened to suffrage in the east had not Billy Morgan and I gone back to testify," the Wichita editor said, and 1914 Progressive gubernatorial nominee.
