**IN PEACE APPEAL  
Mrs. Henry Ford Sends Telegrams to American Mothers.**

Ten Thousand Asked to Pray for Peace Friday.

New York, Nov. 23.—Ten thousand telegrams will be sent today by the Woman's Peace party in initiating a mothers' movement for a conference of neutral nations. Each telegram will be signed by Jane Addams. The most messages will be sent to women's organizations throughout the United States. The expense is to be borne by Mrs. Henry Ford, who has given \$10,000 for the work. Each telegram will ask the recipient to send a telegram to President Wilson to call a conference of neutral nations for the settlement of the present war. Miss Rebecca Shelley, a graduate of Ann Arbor arrived in New York Monday night with Mrs. Ford's check. She turned it over to the treasurer of the Woman's Peace party. To Pray for Peace. One hundred members of the party will assist in sending out the telegrams. Mrs. Ford asks the women of the United States to devote an hour next Friday to a prayer for peace in Europe. The day will be known as "Mothers' Peace Day," and is planned as the first of a series of campaigns. This is the first time that Mrs. Ford has shown in any concrete way an interest in the peace movement. Recently she heard speaking to Deemer make a speech on peace and she says that inspired the gift. Mrs. Ford's Letter. In presenting the money she wrote: "Happy is my own motherhood and sympathizing with the bitter sorrows of the mothers bereaved by the war, I want to foster a demonstration enabling American women to go on record as favoring a conference of neutral nations working toward a just settlement of the great European tragedy." Miss Addams immediately after receiving the gift for the society called together her committees and today the party began its active campaign to deliver letters to mothers in the peace movement. President Wilson has made an appointment to receive at the White House on Friday afternoon Mrs. Philip Snowden of England, wife of the member of parliament, and Mrs. Schwimmer, with Henry Ford of Detroit. Mrs. Schwimmer and Mrs. Snowden representing the belligerent nations of the two sides of the war will present to President Wilson a book of delegates from the women's peace conference at The Hague last spring the resolutions passed at that time.

**FORCED TO WATCH HER**

Hammerstein Gives Bond That Dorothy Vernon Won't Marry.

"It's pretty rough to be compelled to act as the mother of a chorus girl for an entire theatrical season of forty-four weeks; but that's what I'm up against." Such is the declaration made by the company manager of "High Jinks," which is at the Grand today, matinee and night. The manager's remark was brought about through the fact that Arthur Hammerstein, the producer of "High Jinks," has bonded himself for \$50,000 that Dorothy Vernon, the chorus girl in question, will not be permitted to marry while in his employ. In the event that the young woman becomes a bride before next June, the National Surety company of New York will pay to Miss Vernon's mother, Mr. Hammerstein's forfeit. As a general rule managers do not take so much concern in chorus girls; but the case of Miss Vernon is an exceptional one. She regularly is one of the hesitation dances in "High Jinks" and was selected from among fifty applicants as being best fitted for the intricate dance. Miss Vernon is a Brooklyn girl, less than eighteen years old. Her mother consented to let her go with "High Jinks" only on the condition that Mr. Hammerstein bond himself that she would be returned to Brooklyn a single woman, and, as a result, Mr. Manager has his hands full. "It keeps me pretty busy," he said, "watching the stage door Johnnies, as I will have to hang around every evening after the performance to see that Miss Vernon gets to her home before I go to my hotel."

**WENT OUT OF TOWN**

John Hartman Returns and Asks for a Parole.

John Hartman again made an invasion on the Shawnee county courts this morning when A. J. Bolinger, his attorney, filed application with Charles Bower, clerk, for parole. Hartman was guilty of robbing a store in Oakland in Judge Whitcomb's division of the district court several weeks ago. He filed appeal bond. The customary 90 days of appeal limit expired. No papers in the case were submitted to the higher courts. Hartman could not be found. W. E. Atchison, county attorney, filed suit against John Miltonberger and John Stramel, Hartman's bondsmen, for \$500, the amount of Hartman's bond. This morning the county attorney was notified that Hartman had returned and that he "had just been out of town."

Whether or not the suit against the bondsmen will be dropped, the county attorney was unable to say this morning.

**FIND WORK, NOT CELL**

Punishment of Erring Husbands No Longer to Hurt Family.

Chicago, Nov. 23.—Erring husbands brought before the court of domestic relations who plead inability to find employment will have work found for them instead of being committed to jail. In connection with the court an employment bureau will be opened next week. Letters asking the co-operation of large employers of labor in the movement have been sent to firms throughout the city. "Sending a man to jail punishes him, but it also works hardship on his family," said Judge Hopkins, clerk of the court. "We hope this new system will change conditions. The employment plan also will be applied to the boys court. It was announced.
