

Savages Trim the Ducklings by Score of 4 to 3.

Dasher Gets His First Victory of the Season.

If a ball game didn't have a seventh inning in it the Savages would be in a sorry plight. Since the opening of the season Lattimore's men have been making the seventh their big inning and the majority of their games have been won in it.

Upon the team's return home from Denver last week it won from the Bears in the seventh, and in the last game here with Wichita seven runs were put across the rubber in the seventh. And again Tuesday the stunt was repeated when the Battlers came from behind at the beginning of the seventh and counted three, giving them a one-run lead that they held until hostilities were suspended.

Dasher's First Win.

Tuesday's game was the first victory "Animal" Dasher has annexed since the opening of the race. Apparently, the "Animal" had his stuff working, but he was a bit wild. He allowed only six hits but was taken out in the last of the eighth because of wildness. Dasher also had his batting clothes on in the Lincoln fray and got two hits out of three times up.

Then, at Wichita he got a finger hurt and had to take the bench during the series in Denver. And again Tuesday he was put out of the game by being hit in the face with a ball in batting practice. However, Goodwin has a good understanding in Pitcher Lambeth, who worked for him Tuesday.

Almost on Top Again.

If the Savages win from the Ducklings again today they will again be at the head of the league and will be insured an even break at the worst with the best club in the northern division. Catcher Snow, who subbed for Monroe behind the bat Tuesday got away in great shape, the figures show. He had two put outs and two assists and got a hit that figured in the scoring. Monroe is nursing a strained ligament, but it is not thought that it will seriously affect him.

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
Jimmy Murphy Wins Bout.

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

