WAR HITS MARKET

Anything But a Stimulant for Public Buying of Stocks. New York, June 27.—The New York Sun financial review says:

Developments, pointing more strongly than ever to the likelihood of war between this country and Mexico, were not of a character to stimulate public buying, a feature of which the professional element has taken advantage in depressing the general list.

In the opinion of shrewd Wall street observers, the market suffered as much, if not more, from the meagreness of outside participation and lack of support as it did from the activities of the speculators who sought and found many weak spots both among standard railway shares and industrial specialties.

Reported efforts in the direction of mediation on the part of Bolivia and Central American governments, has not, it is believed, done much to allay the reaction of the market. First prices were irregularly changed, but averaged lower.

The feature of the market was a violent break in Corn Products common and preferred, which declined four to ten points, respectively. Prices weakened materially in Argentine, indicated pool liquidation as the source of the movement.

SUBMIT PEACE PLAN

Suggest Police Patrol on Both Sides of Mexican Border. BY CHARLES F. STEWART.

Buenos Ayres, June 27.—A list of suggestions planned to prevent war between the United States and Mexico have been published here. Included in the list was a proposal made by Romulo S. Naon, Argentine ambassador to Washington, for the establishment of a police zone on both sides of the border to prevent a repetition of bandit raids.

PATENT TORPEDO WAITS

Instead of Buying It, Senate Would Spend \$30,000 Experimenting. Washington, June 27.—Five million dollars was appropriated for a torpedo bill as it passed the house, by a senate committee here to be used for purchase and manufacture of mountain-field and siege cannon.

The committee eliminated the \$750,000 provision for the purchase of the John Hays Hammond, Jr. inventions for wireless control of torpedoes, and \$417,000 for installation of one of the Hammond plans and substituted an appropriation of \$30,000 for investigation of the Hammond inventions.

For 25 Million Army Deficiency. An urgent deficiency bill appropriating \$25,000,000 to cover the expense of mobilizing, equipping and transporting national guardsmen called out for Mexican service was prepared today by the house appropriation committee for submission tomorrow.

VILLA WAS SHOT.

Fired Upon From Rear by Angered Countryman. Field Headquarters, June 20, by courier to Columbus, June 26.—Francisco Villa was shot from the rear by a Mexican who had impressed into his gang, during the battle with Carranza troops at Guerrero, but his fate still is unknown.

Hughes, Republican nominee for president, has written a letter to Theodore Roosevelt, it was authoritative learned here, inviting him to take luncheon with him. Mr. Hughes, it is understood, had left to Colonel Roosevelt the matter of fixing a time for their meeting.

KEOKUK BOYS ENLIST

Balked When Favorite Captain Was Retired, But It's All Fixed Up. Des Moines, Iowa, June 27.—Before the Iowa National Guard authorities could carry out their plan of forming a new company L. First infantry, to replace the seventy-five men from Keokuk who refused to take the federal oath because their captain, Clarence E. Powell, had been retired.

They were mustered in last night with Capt. Frank Lebron as their commander and the First infantry is now ready for service on the border and orders are expected today.

MONTGOMERY IS GAME

Will Remit Rent While Head of Tenant Family Is at the Front. Just because he displayed a patriotic spirit, W. P. Montgomery, assistant attorney general, will sacrifice several months' rent on a valuable piece of residence property on the East side.

Montgomery's tenant has gone with Battery A, and the family which occupies the house has no means with which to pay the rent. Some time ago Montgomery found a bargain in Topeka residence property. He had just located a desirable tenant and had collected two months' rent.

Montgomery went to the East side to collect the rent for the ensuing month. An attractive young woman who met the assistant attorney general at the door, told Montgomery her husband had gone with the national guards and she had no money with which to pay rent.

There was one of two courses for Montgomery. He could eject the tenants, or he could pocket his loss. Montgomery chose to lose. "I don't know when the trouble in Mexico will end," Montgomery said today, "but just as long as that man is in actual service, his family can have the house.
