

MUST RAISE PRICE

Suggested That Newspapers Charge Flat 2-Cent Rate.

Publishers Less Influential in Politics Pay More.

Washington, Aug. 3.—T. M. Robertson, assistant chief economist of the federal trade commission, has suggested two methods of relieving the present situation of the paper market. The first is that the manufacturers work out a standard scale of prices based on the quantity which the contract calls for. This plan would automatically settle any dispute over discrimination. The other plan is that the newspaper publishers raise the price of the papers to 2 cents.

It was disclosed at the hearing before the commission that the International Paper company has a reserve of approximately \$250,000 worth of paper. J. H. Serby testified before the commission that in extreme cases the "most favored" men had been able to secure contracts for three years, while the smaller and less influential men were unable to obtain contracts.

Specific instances were cited by witnesses that contracts had been awarded at the low rate of \$2.05, while publishers of larger newspapers less influential in politics had to pay \$5.

The case now rests with the federal trade commission, which is examining evidence and calling new witnesses for private testimony prior to making a final report. It is expected another hearing will take place after September 14.

GASOLINE MAY BE NEXT

Cut in Crude Oil Hits Pennsylvania Field—Can't Handle Supply.

Pittsburg, Pa., Aug. 3.—All grades of Pennsylvania crude oil with the exception of Ragland, were reduced 10 cents a barrel at the opening of the market today and Ragland was reduced 5 cents.

The oil authorities said that as long as there were any prospects of crude oil advancing they were unable to buy the vast quantities stored in this section, but that the moment the price was cut last week they were flooded with so much oil that another cut was deemed advisable. Refiners said that the next move in the market would be reduced quotations for gasoline.
