HUGHES BACK ON STUMP HAMMERS DEMOCRAT PARTY

First Speech of Renewed Junket at Peoria, Ill.

Mrs. Hughes Is Aide-de-Camp of G. O. P. Nominee.

WALLOPS THE ADAMSON LAW

Scorches Wilsonian Reign on Many Subjects.

At Springfield This P. M. and Then Into Wisconsin.

Peoria, Ill., Sept. 19.—Nominee Hughes chose Peoria as the city from which he should hurl forth today the first speech of his second presidential campaign tour. He spoke in the hall in which the state Republican conference was meeting and in an hour's sermon on the nation's needs and future enunciated practically every one of his doctrines on Americanism, a protective tariff, adequate laws covering labor and fair treatment to legitimate business.

The G. O. P. candidate was plainly pleased to get back to campaigning again. He started with a smile at the crowd which greeted him at the station, waved his hat in almost Rooseveltian glee at those who applauded him on the street and in voice and gesture at the Coliseum exhibited a full measure of "pep."

He developed today that the governor did not get the full four days' rest at Bridgehampton he had planned. Saturday he gave over his mind to data collected and arranged for him by his secretary, Laurence Green, and then he is ready to talk, without any notes or other aids to memory. For almost the entire day he was in his "study," as Mrs. Hughes has named it, in the private car of the National industrial conning over notes and just thinking.

The governor—or rather Mrs. Hughes—has turned one of the four staterooms in his private car into a sort of workshop. The first stateroom from the end is his bedroom; the second, his "study"; the third, the "parlor" and the fourth, Mrs. Hughes' bedroom. Mrs. Hughes named them all herself and supervised the arrangements for the governor's comfort.

On his midwestern "junket" the Republican nominee intends to make as one of his principal differences of issue against President Wilson, the Adairson strike which he passed at the executive's behest in order to avert a railroad strike. He has had time to collect some additional data on that measure and the contingency it was designed to meet, and this has served to confirm his belief that the Adairson strike is a "party of broken promises" in principle as well as effect. He has some new material about Mexico and has had additional time in which to study the party's program, legislation which that party is "pointing with pride" in the campaign now on.


Leaving Peoria at noon today, the nominee was scheduled to reach Springfield about 2 o'clock, motoring out to Lincoln's tomb in the early afternoon, and then to give a public address at a meeting at the state fair grounds, under the auspices of the Republican state committee and the state board of education. The secret of his program calls for a public reception and an address before a mass meeting. After this the candidate was due to leave for Wisconsin, where he will campaign in Sheboygan, Manitowish, Green Bay, Appleton, Oshkosh, Fond du Lac and Milwaukee.

TURKS EXILE ARMENIANS

Recently Deported, Refugees Now Ordered to Move From New Home.

Washington, Sept. 19.—The Armenians of Asia Minor, who took refuge in great numbers east of Aleppo, when exiled recently, by the Turks now have been ordered to leave the new locality they had chosen for a home, according to dispatches reaching official circles here today. The step is in line with a series of repressive measures adopted by the Ottoman government, and is believed by many diplomats here to be directed toward ridding the near east entirely of Armenians.

POVERTY SUICIDE, RICH

Supposed Fortune Collapsed But Estate Proves Worth \$200,000.

New York, Sept. 19.—Col. Henry O. Seixas, member of a well known Louisiana family and a Confederate veteran, who committed suicide by shooting here in 1911, at the age of 70, was not penniless as he believed, but left an estate here and in Louisiana and Alabama worth more than \$200,000, according to an appraisal here.

SENDS LESS TO CHINA

U. S. Exports Fall Off While Other Nations Increase.

New York, Sept. 19.—American exports to China have been decreasing steadily, while those of other countries show continuous gains, according to figures on Oriental trade compiled by the foreign trade department of the National City bank.

TROUBLE IN WAR DEPT.

Lewis Machine Gun May Be Means of Hoopring Feuds.

Washington, Sept. 19.—There are indications that old war department feuds may be reopened as the result of efforts by certain officers to have the Lewis machine gun adopted as the official army type.

Bees in Fatal Attack on Horses.

Dumont, Ia., Sept. 19.—A swarm of bees attacked a team of horses belonging to Lloyd Margret, injuring them so badly both horses died in a few hours from the effects of stings. Margret had plowed up the hive accidentally while at work with the team in a stubble field.

CROP IS SMALLER

Apple Production in U. S. Is Below Last Year.

Figures for Entire Country Show Nearly Normal.

Washington, D. C., Sept. 19.—The September 1 forecast of total apple production this year in the United States, as reported by the Bureau of Crop Estimates, United States department of agriculture, is 67,673,000 barrels of three bushels each (agricultural and not commercial basis), as compared with 75,670,000 estimated produced last year, which was not quite 65 per cent more than the past ten years estimated production has exceeded the present forecast five times. Taking the country as a whole, it thus appears that the apple crop will be nearly an average, but 12 per cent smaller than last year's large crop.

The crop is larger than last year in the Atlantic coast states, including New York and Pennsylvania, and in the Pacific coast states, but smaller in practically all the interior states except Michigan, which has about 74 per cent more than last year.

Kansas Crop Drops.

Baldwin appears to be the leading crop this year, with a forecast of 9,260,000 barrels.

The Wineap forecasts a production of 3,794,000 barrels, a decrease of 32 estimated production last year.

Greening forecasts 3,733,000 barrels, an increase of 4 per cent over the estimated production last year.

Northern Spy forecasts 3,402,000 barrels, an increase of 25 per cent over last year's estimated production.

The Wealthy forecasts a production of 2,863,000 barrels.

The Home Beauty, with a forecast of 2,770,000 barrels, is 21 per cent short of last year's estimated production.

The Jonathan variety forecasts a production of only 2,432,000 barrels, which is a reduction of 46 per cent from the estimated crop of last year, and this notwithstanding a material increase in the Pacific northwest.

The Missouri forecasts 2,033,000 barrels, a decrease of 64 per cent from last year's estimated production; Kansas 1,970,000, a decrease of 69 per cent.

The York Imperial forecasts a production of 2,403,000 barrels.

Grimes Golden forecasts a production of 2,650,000 barrels, a reduction of 30 per cent from last year's crop.

The Yellow Newtown (Pippin) forecasts a production of 1,777,000 barrels, which is 4 per cent less than last year's crop.

Fameuse (Snow) forecasts a production of 1,995,000 barrels.

EXAMS. FOR OFFICERS

War Department Preparing to Put Reserve Corps Law in Force.

Washington, Sept. 19.—The war department is preparing to authorize the holding of examinations in the various military departments of the country for officers' reserve corps, created by the last congress.

This corps is expected to contain several thousand officers within two or three years and will be the main reliance of the army for volunteers in the event of war.

The reserve corps will consist of sections corresponding to various staff corps and departments of the regular army. Its members will not be subject to call for service in time of peace, except for specified causes named in the act, and when called, will not be called in a lower grade than that held by them in the reserve corps.

HEAVY RAIN AT FRONT

Halts Operations on Somme—Five Aeroplanes Missing.

London, Sept. 19.—A steady 24-hour downpour of rain has halted the British operations on the Somme front, and there has been no important fighting since yesterday. General Haig reported this afternoon that British troops entered enemy trenches at Ribecourt, Labouze at three separate places, taking prisoners and inflicting casualties.

Near La Vouze northwest of Labouze, we entered the enemy's trenches at three places, capturing prisoners and a machine gun and inflicting many casualties. "Since last night's report five more of our aeroplanes have failed to return," says Haig's report.


