A BIG ENTRY LIST

One Hundred Golfers Expected to Enter C. C. Tourney.

Kansas City and Leavenworth Are Coming Strong.

Thursday morning at 7 o'clock, when the first players tee off in the fourth annual invitation tournament of the Topeka Country club, it is expected that more than 100 golfers will be prepared to participate and make a bid for a share of the honors and a part of the trophy that has been hung up for the players.

The entries are practically all in now. A. J. McNear, who has charge of the lists, said today, "and indications are that all previous records for attendance will be broken."

Topeka will enter a large number of players in the tournament, having both the Shawnee and Country club to draw from. 24 members of the Shawnee club are taking a great interest in the event, hoping that their organization will break into the limelight by copping some of the honors.

In reply to the banter of the Savages to play them for a thousand dollar wager, the members of the Ideal Bakery team, Topeka's undefeated amateur champions, state that they consider the proposition unreasonable, but that they will be glad to take on the Savages at any time under an agreement by which the winner of the game will receive all the gate receipts.

Quite a number of local fans would like to see the two teams clash after the close of the Western league season and many supporters of the Ideal team believe the amateurs would be able to show up the professionals.

The Ideal team has won nineteen straight games this season and claims the amateur championship of the state. The manager of the team said today:

QUEEN TALKS WARLIKE

"Will Defend Rights of Neutrals and Our Independence"—Wilhelmina.

The Hague, Sept. 19.—Queen Wilhelmina struck a warlike note in her speech at the opening session of parliament today. She told parliament that important steps to strengthen the Dutch forces to resist any attack on the country's neutrality are being taken and that the supply of war materials and munitions is growing. She warned belligerents on both sides that Holland is prepared to resist such an attack.

"We will fulfill the duties international law imposes upon neutrals," said the queen. "At the same time we have strongly decided to defend our independence against whomsoever assails it."

3 REGIMENTS HOME
