TAKES ILLS. STAND JOHN'S IRISH UP!

Norway Declines Allies' Veto on Submarines. Redmond Makes Attack on British Rule in Ireland. Not Prohibit Passage Thru or Sojourn in Her Waters. Allies Are Fighting For.

London, Oct. 18.—Reuter's Christiania correspondent says: "Norway has informed the entente allies that it does not recognize it as its duty to prohibit passage thru or sojourn in Norwegian waters by belligerent submarines." The Norwegian note is in response to the memorandum of the entente powers to neutrals suggesting that belligerent submarines should be excluded from neutral waters.

Mr. Redmond gave notice of his intention to attack the government.
