TAKE LAW IN OWN HANDS

London, Oct. 20.—Extremely turbulent conditions in Athens, Wednesday night, are reported in a dispatch from Reuters correspondent at the Greek capital, sent that evening. Greek rioters have taken the law into their own hands despite the presence of strong entente detachments of marines who are given virtually no assistance by the Greek authorities in maintaining order.
