SENATE NOTES

The indications are that the senate is not going to need even what time it has left to dispose of its own business.

The report of Lee Samuel, senate journal clerk, in reply to the resolution of Senator Huffman of Cherokee and adopted on Committee Friday evening, was filed with the senate today.

It places the blame for the insertion of an amendment in the physical supervisor bill upon no one in particular, altho it states that the amendment was attached to the bill after it left his hands and before it reached the state printer.

BILL TO CONFEREES
