Aerial Mail Service in Danger, Declares Praeger.

Starts Fight in Senate for Appropriation Renewal.

HOUSE HAD NO CHANCE TO VOTE

Clause Was Stricken From Bill on Point of Order.

One Hundred Cities of Country Are Interested.

Washington, Jan. 29.—A fight to save the air mail service started today in congress.

The air mail must be abandoned at the end of the fiscal year, June 30, unless the senate restores to the post-office department an \$150,000 appropriation for maintenance of this service, which was cut out by the house in line with its economy program.

Otto Praeger, second assistant postmaster general, went before the senate postoffice committee today to plead for the air mail. He is in charge of it.

100 Cities Interested. Praeger declared today that if the senate does not restore the appropriation, an extensive program of air mail development, which would bring many cities within its scope must be given up.

More than 100 cities have applied for air mail routes. Praeger said an interest in the service is rapidly increasing all over the country.

Members of the senate postoffice committee said they wanted Praeger to give them facts and figures showing how the air mail has worked out financially.

Senator McKellar, Tennessee, said today he will lead a vigorous fight for return of the appropriation.

Advocates of the air mail in the house are confident the appropriation can be kept in the bill if the senate reinstates it.

Representative Ramseyer, Iowa, declared today the house never had a chance to vote on whether the air mail should be continued, the appropriation having been stricken out on a point of order.

PONGEE FROCK FOR SOUTHERN BEACHES





Flu Epidemic Gains in St. Louis.

St. Louis, Jan. 29.—Influenza continued to gain ground in St. Louis today, 445 new cases being reported in the last twenty-four hours as against 429 cases yesterday. The death list reported during the same period showed eleven from influenza and twenty-one from pneumonia as compared with eight from influenza and thirty from pneumonia reported yesterday.

WILL RELEASE YANK FLYERS.

Army Aviators Will Be Returned to American Soil by Mexicans. Brownsville, Tex., Jan. 29.—Arrangements have been completed for release of the two American army aviators held at Guerrero, Mexico, according to military authorities at Fort Brown.

FACE DRUG ACT CHARGES.

Arkansas Candidate for Governor Surrenders to U. S. Marshal. Wichita, Kan., Jan. 29.—John A. Riggs, of Hot Springs, Ark., former candidate for governor of Arkansas, charged with violation of the pure food and drug act, surrendered to a deputy United States marshal here. He was released under bond of \$500. Riggs is president of the Lopes Remedial company, a manufacturer of patent medicines. The factory is here. It is alleged that Riggs mislabeled some of his products.

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TETRAZZINI IS CAUTIOUS NOW.

Grand Opera Singer Disinfects Phone—Holds It Against Chest. Kansas City, Mo., Jan. 29.—Louisa Tetrazzini, famous coloratura soprano, completely recovered from her recent hoarseness, the forces, cancellation of a Dallas engagement, taking any more chances with colds or flu. She has her telephone disinfectant as she has resigned a new room—and she talks with the mouthpiece against her chest.

Pneumonia in Wake of Flu.

Chicago, Jan. 29.—Pneumonia following in the wake of the influenza epidemic today reached the highest level since the contagion appeared more than two weeks ago. Health authorities reported 497 new cases of pneumonia and 77 deaths. Influenza continued to subside. During the last twenty-four hours, 1473 new cases were reported and deaths in that period numbered 87.

NIGHT NEWS SUMMARY

McAllen, Texas—Two army aviators, Louis E. F. Davis and G. E. Grimes, carrying a military message from Fort Brown, Texas, to Nogales, Ariz., were found in Mexico and are held captive by Mexicans. New York—Six bishops, five Episcopal and one Methodist, and sixteen other clergymen of various denominations have signed a petition against deportation of aliens without trial and the suspension of the New York Socialist campaign. Paris—President Poincare, accompanied by Premier Millerand and Marshal Foch, returned to the War Cross on the Belgium cities of Furnes, Dinanude and Ypres, according to advices. Washington—Writing in the current number of the Federation, Samuel Gompers commends Bolshevism completely, "Quality and for all time." Berlin—The condition of Matthias Erber, a critic, according to the Lokal Anzeiger. London—The official report of the parliamentary labor party delegation, which has been investigating conditions in Ireland, securing all alliances with the Nationalist party.
