ABROAD.

William O'Brien, editor of United Ireland, was arrested at Dublin on Sunday while seeing Mr. Labouchere off on the steamer for England. Mr. O'Brien refused to answer a summons to appear before the Magistrates at Mitchelstown, on Friday, and a warrant was issued. He said the whole proceeding was farcical; that the Magistrates had made up their minds to imprison him, and that he would not be a party to the hollow sham of a trial unless he was arrested and taken to the gaol. The offense with which Mr. O'Brien is charged is inciting to riot on the occasion of evictions in County Cork several weeks ago. Addressing the tenants, he said: "I tell you that I am not a party to this business, and I will not fight for your homes."—The casualties of the Mitchelstown (Ireland) riot include three persons killed and the constables and others injured.—News from Henry M. Stanley has been received dated July 2. He was then 10 days' march in the interior, and was proceeding up the Aruwi, which he had found navigable above the rapids. He had landed the steel whaleboat and raft. The members of the expedition were in good health. Stanley expected to arrive on July 22 at the center of the Mohol District and to reach Walelei by the middle of August.
