If your local Postoffice is not a money-order office, the best way is to register your letter. Money may also be safely sent by Express Money Order or Bank Drafts. Do not send local bank checks. Remember also that postal notes are no safer than money or stamps enclosed in an envelope, being cashed by anyone into whose hands they may fall. Postage stamps are a drug, and, while taken, are very inconvenient, because we have more now than we can use, and the Government does not redeem them.




