ALABAMA AND TENNESSEE.

The resignation of R. O. Cox as Mastering Officer has been accepted, owing to his election as Captain of Camp 10.

Reports and lists have been received from John A. Logan Camp, 8, of the defunct Division of Florida, and said Camp has been attached to this Division.

The report of the Adjutant for the quarter ending March 31 shows a gain by muster of 16 members; by transfer, one Camp and 11 members; by resignation, three Camps, with a membership of 67. The loss during the quarter was one member by honorable discharge, two by transfer, and five Camps, with a membership of 140, by suspension. The number in good standing is 14 Camps, with a membership of 245.

Being Department President Emily Parker reported 70 Camps in good standing; relief work amounted to \$2,219 as far as reported. Considering the adverse conditions the past year has been fairly prosperous and the Department President is entitled to much credit for maintaining W.R.C. work at a high standard.

Retiring President Emily Parker was presented with a testimonial of esteem by her friends, Past Department President Steinsmeier making the presentation.

Frank P. Blair Corps, 1, St. Louis, gave a testimonial to the Corps having paid. The evening was a successful one for the Corps.
