GREENE'S BRIGADE

The Splendid Defense of Culp's Hill... Editor National Tribune: I was much interested in the Peninsular Campaign, but am now more so in the Chancellorsville and Gettysburg Campaign.

I followed your description of the battle of Chancellorsville with the greatest of interest... The brigade was the Third of the Second Division, commanded by Gen. George S. Greene.

Slightly disfigured, we were still in the ring... We arrived in the afternoon of July 1, 1863. Gen. Reynolds had been killed. Part of our brigade, and especially our brigade, and no doubt the balance, were feeling their way thru the woods and tangled underbrush.

"Sergeant Lewis, you take a party of the men and throw up a rude breastwork of old logs and stones that lay around."

Our corps, after the battle of Gettysburg, was consolidated into the Twelfth Corps. We were ordered West; opened up that "cracker line" under the command of Gen. Joe Hooker.
