ANSWERS TO CORRESPONDENTS.

S. D. S., Sayville, N. Y.: There is no Federal law exempting pensioners from paying taxes on town or any other property. Levying taxes on real and personal property is a matter of State control entirely...

S. M. S., Hume, Ill.: There is no law or rule prohibiting fourth-class Postmasters from holding a Township office or doing anything else not in conflict with their duties to the public in promptly handling the mails.

S. S., Butler, Pa.: The son of a veteran, if he is of age, can take up a homestead, but the Army service of his father cannot be applied on the time to reduce the period before patent can be issued. One who has already taken up a homestead cannot take up another...
