Arizona at the Fair.

In speaking of the exhibits at the New Mexico Territorial Fair, the Albuquerque Citizen of Wednesday last has the following concerning the display made by Northern Arizona:

For many years liberal and big hearted Arizona has contributed her quatum to the Albuquerque fair, but never with such pleasing effect as to day. It is as much as a mining man can do to get away from the bewitching display of rich ores.

Capt. Wm. H. Hardy, one of the sturdy pioneers of Mohave county, has a display of ores in bulk which runs very high in ruby and brittle silver, gold and lead.

The Elkhart mine of Chloride shows ore that runs 860 in gold and silver and 60 per cent. lead, and the Silver Hill mine in the same district, a very large lead, averages \$40, while the ore from the Empire, a large producer in the same vicinity, yields \$100 in silver and lead.

Several large pieces of Prescott onyx are beautiful. The Riordan Mills at Flagstaff, has a fine display of mouldings, shingles, laths, railings, etc.
