How to Climb Stairs.

The climbing of stairs, which to almost everybody, especially those advanced in years, is very fatiguing, can easily be facilitated somewhat, according to a New York athlete, who says: To throw the body forward, bending at the hips, more than doubles the work. The weight of the body is a load that the muscles and loins must carry and they can carry it easiest if the center of gravity is kept above them. Bending forward imposes on the muscles of the trunk the unnecessary task of holding the load from pitching forward. This is like carrying a load at arm's length, instead of on the shoulder, or on the head, as many Europeans carry burdens. The gentleman gives this advice to stair-climbers: Do not lean forward. Do not hurry. Do not spring from stair to stair. Step firmly, leisurely, and keep erect.




