STOCK NOTES.

The Mogollon Live Stock association meets in Flagstaff on April 5th. There are no dead cattle on the ranges in Arizona, but plenty of fat steers.

Pork packing since March 1st shows a slight increase over the same time last year.

The San Pedro and lower Gila roundups will commence on April 15th.

A special meeting of the San Pedro live stock association was held recently at Benson.

The Texas legislature has imposed a tax of \$150 per year on live stock brokers in that state.

The South-eastern Association will hold its regular semi-annual meeting at Wilcox on Monday, April 4th.

Very few horses are brought in to the board of examiners for the purchase of cavalry horses at Phoenix.

Messrs. Head and Hearst, of Deming, have sold 700 beef steers to Los Angeles butchers at 2 1/2 cents on foot.

Develop the strength of your horses by degrees. Nothing is gained by rushing a green horse into hard work.

The governor of Iowa will not permit a horned animal that has been in Cook county, Ill., inside of twelve months, to be taken into the state.

Ranchmen, keep it constantly in mind that we want fewer and better cattle on the range. This is the straight high-way to a return of good prices and flush times.

Some of the stockmen of Lincoln county, N. M., have established the rule that they will employ no man who is a ranch jumper or who kills cattle not his own.—Stockgrower.

If all the damage done to horses by bad shoeing were charged up to the men who are to blame in such cases there would be blacksmiths in this country that could not pay their indebtedness.

The first bit put in a horse's mouth should be a simple one, such as a plain bar or jointed snaffle. Especially in the first trials should an easy mouth piece be used to induce the animals to take it fearlessly.—Live Stock Journal.

One hundred and twenty-five Arizona steers which had been corn fed in Kansas the past few months, were sold on the Kansas City market this week at \$4.45 per cwt. They averaged 1220 lbs.

Col. Dick Hudson, of the S bar brand, has purchased Lord Gladstone, a thoroughbred Hereford bull. Gladstone is a long yearling, and weighs 1,600 pounds. He is perhaps the finest Hereford ever brought to the south-west.

The Bay State Cattle company had a bunch of 100 head of cattle that averaged 1,427 lbs., and sold for \$4.60. The Anglo-American Cattle company shipped in from their ranch at Oelrich, Dakota, ninety head of fine cattle that brought the handsome figure of \$4.60.—Omaha Stockman.

A determined fight is being made against the Chicago dressed beef syndicate by the stock yards men and butchers of Ohio. Cleveland and Toledo have combined in support of a law requiring an inspection on foot of all beef sold within a radius of forty miles from either city. The bill has passed the senate, and is said to be strong in the house.—Stockgrower.

Native beef cattle during the last five days advanced 25 @ 35 cents per 100 lbs., being the greatest advance established in many weeks. Small reserves, firmer outside markets and lively competition between buyers caused the sudden advance. Sales ranged as high as \$5.50 with 1,331-lb. cattle at \$5.05, some 1,107-lb. cattle at \$4.50, and 896-lb. Nebraska yearlings as high as \$4.40.—Butchers National Journal.

Swift and company, the largest dressed beef firm in Chicago, will move their entire plant to Kansas City this summer, and by August 1st, will require of range cattle alone 1,000 head per day for their establishment. The broad cattle trails are slowly diverging from Chicago to other points, and the glory of that market is being dimmed by the rising importance of Kansas City.
