STOCK NOTES.

Texas has now five and a half million head of cattle, valued at \$137,000,000.

Arizona has gone into quarantine against Europe and Old Mexico for sixty days.

One half of the stockmen of Illinois have been nearly ruined by the recent drought.

The stock commission man's cry just now is hold back all cattle that are not first class.

The next dividend of the Aztec Land and Cattle company will be declared this month.

The best posted among stockmen all agree that the fall will bring in better times for stock-growing.

The ranges in Tonto Basin are in a splendid condition, but the rangers seem to be all at war with each other.

The Aztec Land and Cattle company have recently completed scattering 11,000 pounds of salt over their range.

The new stock car invented by Oney Newell of Denver, is said to be the most complete thing of its kind ever devised.

The capital stock of the Standard Cattle Company of Wyoming has been increased from \$1,000,000 to \$1,500,000.

There has been more rain an 't ere is more grass in northern Arizona than has ever been known in any previous year.

Cattle in Clark's valley and the ranges immediately south of the A and P. railroad are in a splendid condition and very fat.

Phenix papers state that a large tract of land on the Salt river is being negotiated for by Chicago parties for beef fattening purposes.

The strange disease mentioned some time ago as decimating the herds of old Mexico, is still raging, and the veterinarians are absolutely unable to classify it.

Kansas papers state that a large number of Arizona steers are being sent into Kansas for fattening. The steers in this part of Arizona are fat enough for any purpose.

The general round up for Apache county will commence on September 5th and it is evidently the intention of the association to have the work done thoroughly this season.

The Register and Receiver at Prescott has been ordered to restore to the public domain the indemnity lands of the A. and P. Railway which are situated in his district.

On Saturday last Robert Bonner drove Maud S in a road wagon one mile in 2:15. This is the fastest time ever made in a road wagon and Mr. Bonner is 30 pounds over the regulation weight.

It is reported that eastern capitalists are negotiating for the purchase of the Chilli grant, located near the Sandia mountains, in Bernalillo county, N. M. The purchasers will colonize the grant.

It is a common thing at present in Apache county, Ariz., to come across the bodies of horse and cattle thieves hanging from trees. Three rustlers have been discovered during the past week in this predicament.

Sunflowers are used in Wyoming Territory for fuel. The stocks when dry are as hard as maple wood and will make a hot fire, and the seed heads with the seeds in are said to burn better than the best hard coal.

An acre of sunflowers will furnish fuel for one stove for a year.

The California Alta says: A regular business is done in exporting burros from New Mexico to New York to be used as riding animals for children. The price in New Mexico is nominal, and they sell in Gotham readily for \$50 and \$100. They are a patient trusty animal, and when groomed and cared for, quite pretty.

Ranchmen all knew Dave Berry, of Cottonwood Falls, Kan., but they will know him no more on earth, he having died at Long Branch recently. Dave was one of the wealthiest cattle men in Chase county, and had hosts of friends. He was manager of the Berry Cattle Co., of Montana, and owned cattle in several localities.

The Stock Indicator says: Beef cattle are to-day worth a dollar per hundred pounds more than they were a month ago, while hogs, although not showing such rapid advance, have been steadily progressing. This is certainly encouraging to stockmen and farmers who have been sufferers by the reason of low prices, for a long time. It now begins to look as though the reaction had really begun, and that better prices are likely to prevail in the future until over-production again causes a decline.

The dressed beef men some time ago made an application to the Interstate Commission for a material reduction in the rates for shipment, which is now fixed at 65 cents per one hundred pounds. This they claim is exorbitantly high and materially interferes with their business. The fight before the commission promises to be fierce one as a meeting has been called by chairman Blanchard to

meet in the rooms of the Central Traffic Association Aug. 23rd. The various roads defendant in the dressed beef cases will then consider the line of defense to be adopted before the National Inter-State Commerce Commission and the various counsel will adopt some uniform plan of defense and argument. The result of this fight will be closely watched.—Miles City Stock Grower

Lucky Boston.
At the last drawing of the Louisiana State Lottery held in New Orleans June 14, New England was especially favored by the blind goddess, as parts of both the second grand prize of \$100,000 and of the fourth prize of \$25,000, as well as a great number of smaller prizes, were drawn by tickets held in Maine and Massachusetts. Mr. A. B. Clark and Mr. R. J. Tiffin of this city each held a portion of the ticket that drew the fourth grand prize, and each are correspondingly elated.—Boston (Mass.) Courier, July 2.
