Buy With Care.

We would admonish our people to stand by their cattle herds. As long as it will pay to grow anything it will pay to grow beets. The price may become depressed and over production may confront us, but for all that there is as good a margin on cattle as any other agricultural product, and their care and attention is less laborious than grain growing. It is true that we have a territorial market for our field products and the bulk of our beets. But notwithstanding this, the advantage of free pasturage two-thirds of the year places the stock in the industry in advance of tilling the soil. Yet here as elsewhere the two may be advantageously combined. In fact, stock growing on a small scale offers the best advantage when connected with farming. Since range husbandry has well-nigh run its day of usefulness, we must in the future depend upon the farmer and owner of the soil for our beef. We know of no better use to which his possessions can be applied. The farmer without means must, of course depend upon the tilling of his soil, but as soon as he is able to take care of a few head of stock through the winter he should manage to get them, a few on the shares if not able to buy. There is less risk in running growing stock in this manner than any other, and as long as men till the earth we can recommend no better business for permanent and profit.—Ex.
