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EVERYWHERE.

The supreme court is in session at Tucson this week. Eighty acres of farming land have just been sold near Phoenix for \$8,500.

The Colorado River is reported to be twelve feet above high water mark at Yuma.

An exchange states that the San Carlos Indians have planted 500 acres more grain this year than during any previous season.

There are said to be 649 widows, by actual count, in the village town of Oberlin, Ohio.

A man at Garden City, Kan., has a herd of thirty-five bisons, thoroughly domesticated, docile and taming.

A townsie company has been formed in the Gila Bend section and another at Texas Hill, both of which have been incorporated.

A fire at Fort Lowell on the morning of the 14th inst. destroyed the post library; loss about \$700. The building was also destroyed; loss about \$2,000.

The House Committee on Public Lands has decided, by a party vote, to formulate the annual bill providing for the forfeiture of all unclaimed land grants.

The dead body of Michael Murphy was found on an island near Phoenix last week. He probably lost his life in an attempt to cross the river at its flood.

It is feared that Rafael Andoradu was drowned in the Salt River a few days ago. He left for his home in Tempe on Thursday last, and has not since been heard from.

A joint resolution passed the House for investigating the practicability of constructing reservoirs for the storage of waters in the arid regions of the United States.

The arrangements proposed for the removal of the Army of the Potomac at Gettysburg next summer contain an address of welcome to be given by George William Curtis, and a poem by George Parsons Lathrop.

A monument which will cost \$2,000,000 will soon be erected in Panama to the memory of General Bolivar, the liberator of Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Venezuela. Each of the five republics will contribute \$400,000 for the purpose.

Geo. Parker, a brakeman on the Arizona & Sonora road, was killed in Benson on Friday last. While uncoupling a car in the Santa Fe yard he caught one of his feet in the switch frog, and being unable to extricate it was run over and killed. His body was frightfully mangled.

The other day, near Charlotte, N. C., a poor workman named Marston accidentally struck with a hammer one of a heap of stones that had long lain unnoted in a vacant lot, and was astonished to find the rock rich in gold.

The discovery has caused excitement, and it is asserted that the rocks and the bed of the streams about Charlotte are full of gold.


