CONTINENTAL ROAD. COOPER IS INDICATED.

Plan for Railroad to Parallel Canadian Pacific.

Quebec, Nov. 6.—Upper Canada is to be tapped by a new railroad that will span the North American continent and discharge its traffic at either the Atlantic or Pacific seaboard.

The new line is called the Transcanada Railway and will be extended from Quebec on the east to Fort Simpson on the west.

The line from Quebec to Fort Simpson will be 284 miles shorter than from Quebec to Vancouver by the Canadian Pacific. From Quebec to Yokohama, via Port Simpson, the distance will be about 722 miles shorter than from Quebec to Yokohama via Vancouver.

The new road will be England's answer to Russia's Transsiberian Railway. It is said that England, using the new line, could put troops into Manchuria, for instance, four days sooner than Russia, by using the Transsiberian road, could place troops from Moscow in Vladivostok.

Work on the new road was begun on June 28, 1901. The projectors expect to have the road ready for business from one end to the other in 1907.

The road from Quebec to Port Simpson, a town in the west central part of British Columbia, on the Pacific ocean, will be 2,330 miles long and the estimated cost of construction will be \$96,750,000. The officers and directors of the road are all Englishmen and Canadians, with the exception of George Early Church, an American.

The line as projected will parallel the Canadian Pacific and will cross the continent almost on a straight line about 280 miles to the north of the latter road.

Fall Hunting.

Nearly every lover of the gun and rifle has a choice of the game he will pursue, says Country Life in America. This one is never so happy as when marking down a covey of quail. To another the prairie chicken, or, if he be Eastern bred the ruffed grouse, furnishes the keenest sport. In a third the flight of wild fowl alone has power to snap the chains of business and send him forth into the marshes. With others it is squirrel shooting, the pursuit of rabbit with beagles, riding to hounds in the chase of Sir Reynard, while the lover of the rifle and the eternal mystery of the deep woods finds no such pleasure as in the pursuit of big game—moose, bear and deer. Many there are to cry down the hunt as catering to barbaric and the least human of the instincts which are the endowment from our forefathers. Therein do they do grave injustice to a class wherein are found some of the truest gentlemen and noblest natures whom we delight to honor. They do gravely mistake the motive which sends the true sportsman afield when he hears the challenge of the quail. It is not the mere desire to kill; in truth, that were butchery. But, rather, it is the longing to match skill and slowly acquired knowledge of the ways and habits of the little brown birds against their swift wings and inherent cunning which for lack of a better term we call instinct. And beyond even this, it is for the pleasure of being afield, for the surroundings, the setting of the favorite sport, for the bracing air and for the knowledge of the great outdoor world which every tramp with dog and gun increases. So the true sportsman takes an honest pride in his skill, so be it his eye has been true and his hand steady while he gave his bird every chance of a fair flush. But, so be it that he misses, his chagrin is tempered with respect for and a certain satisfaction in the escape of the little wild life which has proved more than his match. And though his bag be light he will return home in the gloaming contented in mind and once more a simple child of nature.

London Crime.

Rarely does any official report contain such depressing matter as that on prisons just issued from the Home Office, says the London correspondent of the Baltimore Herald. It formally records that during last year the number of people in prison increased by between 17,000 and 18,000, as compared with the previous year. In London criminality had so largely increased that between 3000 and 4000 prisoners of both sexes have to be transferred to provincial jails for lack of adequate accommodation in the metropolis. Nor is this terrible growth of lawlessness of an abnormal character; it appears to have acquired normality, judging from the fact that the number of London commitments increased from 38,373 in 1891 to 53,591 in 1901.
