to an operation which was per-
formed on his mouth aboard of
Mr. Benedict's yacht. Mr. L.
Clarke Davis, of the "Public
Ledger," Philadelphia, who is
an intimate friend of the Presi-
dent, denies indignantly that the
President is suffering from any
disease which could cause the
country and the friends of Cleve-
land any alarm or uneasiness
whatsoever.

The Chronicle of the 9th inst.
contains a lengthy Washington
dispatch in which it is stated
that Minister Will's will be in-
structed to make arrangements
for an election to be held in
Hawaii, to decide on the future
form of government to be estab-
lished according to the will of
the Hawaiian people under a
mild American protectorate,
which will guarantee non inter-
ference of any foreign powers
and the preservation of internal
peace and quietness. The Chro-
nicle further states that the U. S.
forces in Honolulu will be re-
inforced by other men-of-war
while the election and establish-
ment of the new government
takes place.

In regard to the Chinese exclu-
sion act, a special to the New
York World from Washington, on
September 11th, says:

The decision of the Adminis-
tration to enforce the Geary Act
so far as the funds available will
permit has drawn a vigorous pro-
test from the Chinese Govern-
ment, which was presented to-day
to Secretary Gresham by Yang
Yu, the new Chinese Minister,
and the situation has become se-
riously complicated. The state-
ment that it has been decided to
suspend the operation of the law,
however, is flatly denied by
Secretary Gresham, who said to
the World correspondent to-night
that neither the President nor
any member of the Cabinet would
or could suspend the operation or
execution of a law of Congress,
and it is not true that the Chinese
Minister has been assured that
the Geary law would be suspend-
ed pending the passage by Con-
gress of other legislation.

Secretary Gresham declined to
say anything further in regard to
his interview with the Chinese
Minister, excusing himself upon
the ground that the conference
was official, and that it would be
contrary to diplomatic procedure
to make anything public regard-
ing it.
