HAWAIIAN CABLE.

Favorable Outlook for the Con-
struction of the Needed Tel-
elgraph Line.

The subject of a cable line from California to the Hawaiian Islands is likely to be seriously considered by the present Congress and to attract more attention than heretofore because of the recent discussion of our relations with the islands.

Gov. McCreary, of Kentucky, has introduced in the House the bill introduced by Senator Morgan in the last Congress, with the omission of some superfluous matter. Gov. McCreary introduced the bill at the request of Gen. Marine, who has long taken an interest in the subject, and intends at an early meeting of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs to refer it to a sub-committee for consideration. The bill makes no appropriation from the United States Treasury, but simply authorizes Celso Caesar Moreno and his associates to construct and maintain the cable, provided it is done within five years. The line is to be subject to a number of conditions in favor of the Government, and the equal right of American citizens to the same rates as those enjoyed by citizens of the most favored nations. The third section of the act excludes the idea of monopoly by providing that nothing contained in it shall be construed to limit the United States in granting to other persons or companies similar privileges. A bill of this sort, requiring no Government guarantee or grant, is probably the only one which has any chance in a Democratic Congress.
