The Poverty Bay "Standard" of the 12th January has the following:

"The Zealandia arrived at Auckland on the 10th inst., and has been quarantined, having two cases of small-pox on board. They broke out after leaving Honolulu, one on the 3rd, and the other on the 7th inst., both sufferers are steerage passengers. They are doing well. The Auckland cargo will be transferred to the schooner that has been sent down with coal, and Auckland passengers will be sent into quarantine."  
One of the passengers landed at Auckland from the Zealandia, died the following day. The cause of his death was more from exposure while being landed, than from his disease.
