GRATIS.

The steamer Mary Tatham sails at 3 o'clock to-day, for Hongkong.

The receipts of sugar for the past week amounted to 11,682 packages.

The Band will give a Concert at the Hawaiian Hotel this evening, (circumstances permitting.)

The bark Adonis sailed for New York yesterday; she took away 12,739 pkgs of sugar, weighing 1,313,963 lbs.

The Honolulu Athletic Association have secured the use of Thomas' Park, and will lay it out for a recreation ground.

His Majesty the King leaves for a trip to Maui and Molokai on the Likelike tomorrow, returning to Honolulu on Sunday, March 26th.

The DAILY BULLETIN, containing the programme of the Band Concert, was distributed at Emma Square on Saturday afternoon last.

The schr General Miller, Capt. Morse, sailed from Kahului on the 17th inst. for San Francisco. She took away 2533 bags of sugar valued at \$20,643.

2000 copies of the DAILY BULLETIN were printed last week. They were distributed throughout the city, and forwarded to the different Islands for distribution, and also by mail to the United States and Europe.

The Waimanalo telephone line will be finished on Wednesday or Thursday. The above line, and the one for Punahou, are both up as far as the road to Kailua, about a mile from the foot of the Pali, on the Koolau side.
