Popularity of the Omnibusses.

Work for the Marine Railway was commenced on Wednesday. A gang of men are employed laying a railway track, which will run from the quarries at the foot of Punchbowl to the sea, about 600 feet from the foot of Punchbowl street towards the quarantine buildings. The track will be about 4,200 feet long (nearly a mile), and will be laid down on Alapai and South streets, crossing Beretania, Young, King and Queen streets.
