Mr. Adams will sell this morning at 9:30, two boats saved from the wreck of the Norval.

The steamers Lehua for Molokai and Maui, and Mokoli for Koolau, leave this afternoon at 5 o'clock.

Yesterday, being Palm Sunday, the Roman Catholic Church was filled to overflowing at the morning service.

An adjourned meeting of the Stockholders of the Musical Hall Association will be held this (Monday) evening at the Hall, at 7:30 o'clock.

The brigette J. D. Spreckels, Capt' Friis, sailed from Kahului on the 30th ult. for San Francisco, with 6,916 bags of sugar, valued at \$50,593 12.

The steamers James Makee for Kapaa, Kilauea, and Hanalei, and C. R. Bishop for Nawiliwili, Koloa, Eleele, and Waimea, leave this afternoon at 5 o'clock.

No tidings have yet come to hand from Hawaii of the missing boat of the burned ship Norval, containing the mate and seven men. It is to be hoped that they have been picked up by a passing vessel, being in the track of California bound ships.

The well being bored on the premises of H. H. Keelikolani, at Palama, had on Saturday reached a depth of some 300 feet, and the water rose to within two feet of the surface. Major Gulick has a flowing well at Kalihi.

8,000 packages of sugar came to hand this morning.

The bark Buena Vista which arrived Saturday, has on board two Indians belonging to the Neah Bay tribe, which were picked up at sea by Capt. Calhoun about 50 miles off Cape Flattery. They were sealing in their canoe near their reservation at Neah Bay, W. T., for the schooner Lottie. A heavy gale coming up, they were unable to return to the schooner and were blown out to sea. Capt. Calhoun also saved their canoe and three seals they had caught.

The question is asked, What is the meaning of the gorgeous display of native soldiery, in uniform, both horse and foot, on the streets of a Sunday forenoon? We have been informed that the troops gather for inspection on that day, concluding with Divine service.

Last Saturday, a native workman on the Kaumakapili Church, in coming down from the roof fell a distance of some twenty feet to the ground, but luckily without breaking any bones. He was badly cut and bruised about the face and head. He was attended by Dr. Fitch, who says he will soon be all right again.

The Music Hall was well filled on Saturday evening by a fashionable audience, there being a large attendance of ladies to witness the second performance of the Honolulu Amateur Dramatic Club. Two pieces, a Farce and an Extravaganza, were well put on the stage, and the performers did themselves credit throughout. The singing was excellent, and elicited rounds of applause. In fact, everybody went away apparently well pleased with the evening's entertainment. We may be allowed, however, to remark that it would be well for some of our amateurs to cultivate the habit of speaking louder on the stage, in order to be distinctly heard in all parts of the house.
