## LATE FOREIGN ITEMS.

Mr. Lowell, the American Minister at London, was not asked to Leopold's wedding, just as Mr. Welch, his predecessor, was not invited to the Duke of Connaught's. The reason was that neither was an Ambassador nor a Minister representing a royal family. Mr. Carter, as Commissioner for King Kalakaua, was not in London at the time, otherwise he would have been invited, of course.

It is understood that private dispatches from Egypt state that the situation is becoming alarming, and it is generally considered that the presence of Turkish troops is necessary to prevent an outbreak.

Brigandage is broken up in Sicily. The robbers have adopted another profession—hotel-keeping.

The Mansion House Jewish Relief Fund amounted to £52,000. The Committee dispatch 600 refugees to America weekly, at a cost of £1,500.

A letter has been found in the sleeping room of the Sultan of Turkey threatening his life unless his present arbitrary plans are changed for liberal ones.

In reply to the protest of Turkey against the presence of the English and French Squadrons at Alexandria, England and France inform the Porte that the vessels will leave as soon as the durable and normal state of things is reestablished.

St. Petersburg, May 24th.—The Official Messenger announces that the Government is resolved to punish inexorably all outrages against the persons and property of the Jews.

The House Committee on Naval Affairs unceremoniously sat down upon Calkin's scheme to start another expedition to the North Pole. The Committee took the broad ground that science had not been benefitted by any of these expeditions, all of which cost a great deal of money.

New York, May 23rd.—When Postmaster Pearson reached his office yesterday, he found a postal addressed to President Arthur notifying him that if he didn't recall Minister Lowell from England, and ask unconditional surrender of all American citizen in British dungeons, without trial, he would be assassinated. The writer will be sought for.

Chicago May 23rd.—The Journal's Washington dispatches says: The latest Polar scheme is by J. Palmarts of the Belgium Geographical Society, now visiting this country. He has devoted much time to Arctic study, and proposes to explore the Polar regions in a cigar-shaped steel vessel, running under water, and obtaining oxygen by the decomposition of water. Palmarts says the experiments he has made develop the practicability of his scheme. He proposes a sixty days' voyage north from Spitzbergen.
