**Late Items from the Colonies.**

**NEW ZEALAND.**

There have been severe storms and heavy floods in all parts of the colony.

The Maori Winiata, who murdered an Englishman named Packer, in 1876, and who has ever since been taking refuge in the King country, has now been captured.

The Maori prophets Te White and Tohu have visited Dunedin in charge of Mr. Butler, the Native Minister's private secretary. Te White and Tohu have expressed themselves much interested and pleased with Dunedin. They are said to be very docile and good-humored in their deportment.

The *New Zealand Herald* reports that there is rumor of a probable fight between two hapus of the Ngapuhi tribe, the one residing at a kanga, Pehiawhiri (near Ngungura), and the other hapu living at Ruapekapeka. The *casus belli* is concerning some land at Ruapekapeka, Bay of Islands, which is claimed by both parties, and has been the subject of litigation on the Native Land Court. There are, it is said, only 100 fighting men at Pehiawhiri, while there are 300 fighting men at Ruapekapeka. Both parties are armed with weapons of a heterogeneous character, ranging from the "Brown Bess" pattern to some very neat modern rifles and fowling-pieces. It was at Ruapekapeka that one of the most vigorous and hotly-contested fights in Heke's war took place.

**QUEENSLAND.**

The gold escort from Charters Towers has brought 50,512 ounces of gold to Brisbane since the 1st of January.

Sugar-crushing is becoming general in the Maryborough district.

**SOUTH AUSTRALIA.**

In reply to a Presbyterian deputation, the Governor has promised to transmit to Her Majesty the Queen a petition for the establishment of a protectorate over the New Hebrides Islands, which was agreed to by the Intercolonial Presbyterian Conference.

Attention is being frequently called to the defenceless condition of South Australia. The fort of Glenville is in charge of one man, the powder magazines are unprotected, and the armory is supervised by three or four old soldiers.

**SOUTH SEAS.**

"It is evident that the natives first murdered the European trader, then looted the store, and finally burned the premises. When they got the arms and ammunition they were easily taught the murderous use of them by some returned Polynesian labourer who had been civilized at Maryborough or Mackay, and, as a matter of course, there was not one of our fishing-smack men-of-war near to avenge the outrage. There will never be either security or peace in the South Seas or on the coast of New Guinea until we have swift steam cruisers here within three days' steaming, the captain holding *carte blanche* to punish promptly and effectively, without the tedious and expensive formality of a ridiculous trial and final release in Sydney."

A French engine-driver, named Grisel, has saved the lives of 150 persons by refusing, at the risk of dismissal, to take his train over a railway bridge which, in a few minutes afterwards, fell to pieces.
