COLONIAL NEWS.
NEW SOUTH WALES.

Sir Henry Parkes is very ill and had shown no signs of recovery on the departure of the steamer. The Germans in Sydney have held a very successful "Jahrmak" or fair for the benefit of the German Evangelical Church. It was both novel and pretty. Vessels from Cape Colony are quarantined for small-pox and from Manila for Cholera. The Fijian attendant of the Sir Arthur Gordon has symptoms of variola. The steamer Gunga on which he is—is quarantined. The synod are busy deciding on the nomination of three clergymen, one of whom will be selected as the Bishop of Sydney. Crime seems to be on the increase as the number of cases to be tried is double what was on the list five years ago.

VICTORIA.

Archbishop Goold has received many expressions of sympathy on his escape from Farrell, the assassin's bullet. Educational matters are attracting great attention and efforts are being made to have portions of the Bible read in Government schools. The railway system is found to pay the Government well on some lines, but on others they are losing as much. A man named Robert Burns was tried for the murder of a man, supposed to be a mate of his, whose headless body was found some months ago, and acquitted, on leaving the Court he was arrested for the murder of two other men.
