A tramway from the mainland, at Coconut Island, and crossing said island on to the outlying rocks could be built without a great deal of expense, and the rock taken over to it where it was needed for the filling in of the breakwater.

Second, we need, and the Government ought to put up for us a wharf, or wharves on the Waiakea side, where large ships could lie and discharge or take on freight.

We might go on to speak of the water supply necessary for our town, but as an appropriation has been made for water works for us even though it is insufficient, yet we will not say anything about it at present.
