HAYTI IN DANGER.
New York, Sept. 4.—The Norwegian steamer Alert arrived this morning from Haytian ports and reports that a climax in Hayti's disturbed affairs will undoubtedly be reached soon. The news of the return to the Haytian capital of the exiles from Kingston, Jamaica, is being industriously circulated in other large cities of the republic, and the forts guarding several seaport towns are strongly garrisoned. It is asserted that orders have been issued by Hippolyte if the exiles who have returned to the city make a successful attack on the palace the guns were to be turned on the city. So strong is the belief that a revolution will soon break out that many foreign residents have moved out of Port-au-Prince or are sending their families away. On the day of the Alert's departure Hippolyte's family was leaving Port-au-Prince for Cape Haytian. Hippolyte is said to have lost confidence in the strength of his soldiers and is preparing to follow his family to Cape Haytian at the first approach of the insurrectionists. From what can be learned of the insurrectionist, they are still at Kingston actively preparing, it is said, to leave that place to make a descent on the Haytian capital.

WAS JEFF. DAVIS?
St. Louis, Sept. 6.—A special to the Republic from Newburg, W. Va., says that George M. Harris of Ritchie County was a member of the court-martial which investigated the death of Lincoln and condemned Mrs. Surratt, has just finished a history of the assassination of President Lincoln. The history was compiled from the stenographers' notes in General Harris' possession. In the book Harris boldly asserts that Jefferson Davis and certain members of his Cabinet were interested in and encouraged the assassination of Lincoln. He fortifies the statement by a large amount of documentary evidence. The book will create a sensation.

"A QUEER PARLIAMENT"
London, Sept. 6.—In a communication just made public Mr. Gladstone writes in favor of increased representation of labor in Parliament, but deprecates the formation of a labor party. His objection to such a party, in his words, is on the ground that "If every class of the community exercised the right to form a party we should have a queer Parliament."


