THE CHILEAN AFFAIR STILL UNSETTLED.

Minister Egan in Chile requested the Argentine Minister to note the presence of police about the American Legation. Minister Urriburu of the Argentine Republic accordingly was to call a meeting of foreign Ministers, for the purpose of requesting the attention of the Chilean Government toward the surveillance of the municipal police over the American legation.

An attempt had been made the previous Saturday night to arrest the United States Minister's son Frank. The Government refused to grant the release under bonds of one of the refugees at the United States Legation, claiming that he must first leave the Legation, surrender himself to the Chilean authorities, and submit to imprisonment. This is considered another insult to the United States.

A long letter has been received at the State department, Washington, from Minister Egan, but its contents are not known. It is understood that no action will be taken by the American Government until officially advised by the Chilean authorities of the result of the investigation of the killing of the sailors of the Baltimore. The Yorktown was the only U. S. vessel at Valparaiso, but the Boston was expected in a day or two.

Senator Fair of Nevada blames English merchants with promoting bad feeling against the States, not hoping to embroil Chile in war but to injure trade with the United States.

A Santiago correspondent of the London Times says: In consequence of the delay in the trial of persons concerned in the Baltimore riot, the Chilean Congress proposes to abolish the antiquated secret Spanish procedure for a system of open trials. The delay causes irritation here.

THE London Times regards Joseph Chamberlain as the new Unionist leader in the Commons.

Emperor Francis Joseph of Austria is seriously ill with influenza.

Germany and Hungary have both adopted the commercial treaty between Germany and Austro-Hungary.

The Italian Chamber by a vote of 228 to 68 adopted the new duties on sugars of high quality.

The weather on the Continent is extremely cold. Several persons have been frozen to death in the French provinces.

San Francisco, Dec. 22, per S. S. Australia.

UNITED STATES.

A monster bridge is projected between New York and New Jersey. Its designs by J. W. Balat have been accepted by the acting Secretary of War. The aim of the company in erecting the bridge is to concentrate all the railroads coming from the east, north, west and south into one great Union Depot.

Wait Whitman, the aged poet, Russell Sage, Jr., New York, and Jerome I. Case, the well-known horseman who gave his initials to the racer J. I. C., are all reported dying.

Two indictments have been returned against Edward M. Field, son of Cyrus W., one of which charges him with the larceny of 350 shares of Edison Electric Light Company stock.

Senator Preston Plumb of Kansas died suddenly of apoplexy in Washington, Dec. 20, aged 54 years.

The S. S. City of Peking arrived at San Francisco on the 21st, with two white steerage passengers down with smallpox in its most virulent form. The cabin passengers were landed at Angel Island for a two weeks' quarantine. Among them was Vice-Admiral Nazermuff of the Russian Navy.

Mr. Stieckler, a World's Fair Commissioner from Germany, has landed at Hoboken and has in his possession what is said to be the sword carried by Christopher Columbus at the time of his discovery of America. The sword belongs to the museum at Salzburg, and has been lent for exhibition at the Fair.
