## AMERICAN LETTER.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 1, 1892.  
POLITICAL.  
The Iowa Republican go to the Convention uninstructed, but it is generally understood that they are solid for Harrison. They have cut loose from prohibition as a party measure.  
The State Central Committee of the Prohibition party of California met at the Palace Hotel in this city March 23d. They will hold the State Convention at Fresno, on May 25th. Representation was fixed as follows: Two delegates at large from each county and one delegate for each twenty votes cast for Bidwell for Governor at the last election, delegates to be eligible to seats in the convention regardless of sex.  
It is said M. H. de Young is in the fight for United States Senator. Kelly and Crimmins are supporting him, while the other factions, Burns and Wilson, are decidedly in favor of C. N. Felton.  
The Michigan Prohibitionists won't fuse. A scheme for fusion with the People's Party was defeated at the outset at a meeting of the State Convention held at Grand Rapids. The National convention will be held at Cincinnati June 29th and 30th.  
Senator Stanford says: "I am a Republican, and if the Republican party should tender me their nomination for President I would accept it."  
The Minnesota Democrats say they will send a solid delegation for Cleveland to the Democratic National Convention.  
The presidential probabilities are narrowing down to two in the two old parties, the Democrats favoring Cleveland and the Republicans Harrison.  
The Sentinel, which has been the leading Democratic daily of Indiana, and has forcibly maintained the candidacy of ex-Governor Gray for the presidency, has declared for Cleveland, and called on Gray to withdraw in his favor.  
The present indications are that Cleveland will be nominated by acclamation and that no other name will be presented to the convention.  
It is said that Hill intends to withdraw and that he is practically out of the race.  
Hill's followers in New York are now advocating the nomination of Governor Flower.  
Republicans carried the municipal elections at Utica and Little Falls, (N. Y.) last Tuesday.  
Joseph Chamberlain, member of Parliament, addressed a great meeting of Unionists, in London, on the political situation. In his arraignment of the Liberals he said they had manifested their willingness to place the Protestant part of Ireland in the power of the Papacy at the bidding of a political Pope.

## FOREIGN AFFAIRS.

Great distress still prevails in Northern Hungary in spite of the relief measures by the Government. At Oreclic the peasants, dissatisfied with the distribution of relief, barricaded the house of the burgomaster, set fire to it, intending to burn him and his family. They were rescued only after a desperate conflict.  
Franz Schneider has paid the penalty for the crime of murdering the servant girls near Vienna recently. His execution, which was by strangulation, was so horrible that the spectators had to turn away. Men pulled downward on his limbs to secure strangulation. His wife Rose Schneider was sentenced to life imprisonment.  
News from the city of Mexico states that six train-wreckers were caught tearing up spikes on the Central Railroad and immediately shot.  
The enthusiasm over the American contributions of provisions received by the steamship Indiana show no signs of abatement, says a despatch from Nihau (Russia). Employees in the arsenal there chartered seven steamers and went to the steamship Indiana and greeted the captain. All sorts of salutes were given and wild yells went up for America and everything American.  
Word from Rome says the trial of the anarchists arrested for participating in the May riots was concluded March 24th. Cipriani and Falla were sentenced to two years and eight months imprisonment and to pay a fine of 1500 lire. Korner, the German student, was sentenced to one year and a fine of 506 lire. Forty-nine others were sentenced to terms ranging from two years to twenty-five days, to police surveillance and minor restrictions.  
Le Journal des Debats stated that the head anarchists, responsible for the recent dynamite explosions, have resolved to use poison for their destructive work instead of dynamite, which has caused but a trifling loss of life. The dynamites have been experimenting to discover a poison which would cause death without the risk of detection. A sample of poison was found during the search of lodging-houses.  
A number of documents written in cipher were found in the possession

During the process of deepening the channel at the entrance to Honolulu harbor the Dredger will be in operation night and day. At night there will be a danger signal placed on the forward derrick of Dredger about 20 feet above sea level, which can be seen by all vessels approaching the harbor. The signal consists Red Red of three red lights White and a white light \* \* \* \* \* the red lights being about 3 feet apart with the white light in the center. Red \* \* \* \* \* All steamers crossing the bar will stop at a safe distance from the Dredger and give one blast of their whistle which will be answered by a single blast from the Dredger, to be followed by three blasts from the Dredger when the passage is clear and they can proceed.  
The Tug will be on hand when not otherwise engaged to assist sailing craft in passing the Dredger when necessary.
