Hawaiian Electric Co.

The ice plant purchased by Alexander Young for this company will be shipped by the Frick Manufacturing Co., Chicago, early in the present month and it is expected that the company will be making ice by Sept. 1st next. The cold storage department will be as complete as any in the United States. Theodore Hoffman, Superintendent of the Electric Company, in speaking of electric lights at Waikiki, said: "My men are so busy arranging for lights in the city proper that I have been unable to complete the Waikiki line, but I hope to finish it very soon." All of the residents in the locality of the park have made application for the service. When this is completed the company will be ready to light the entire Waikiki road with arc lights. This, however, cannot be done until the legislature will pass a bill authorizing it and make the necessary appropriation.

"A step in this direction will add very much to the value of the property in that locality," said Mr. Hoffman in conversation with a reporter for the BULLETIN, "and should be urged by men who have interests there."


