

Shipping Notes.

The Hawaii brought 5187 bags
sugar.
There are eight whalers laid up
in San Francisco harbor.

The Alden Esse is now along-
side the W. G. Hall and is taking
in the latter's cargo of sugar, 3200
bags.

Both the Helen Brewer and the
Tillie Starbuck are being coated
with chemical paint below the
water line.

The Warren steamer Sagamore,
Captain Fenton, has arrived at
Boston from Baltimore with her
port side stove in and otherwise
damaged by collision with an un-
known two-masted British steamer.

A steerage passenger on the
steamer Paris is detained at Ellis
Island, N. Y., pending inquiry into
the truth of his story that he is the
son of a wealthy Earl, notwith-
standing the fact that he had no
money about him.

The Manuel Llaguno hauled up
to Wilder's wharf this morning.
She is one of the old style wooden
vessels, copper bottomed, of 1650
tons register. She will carry away
about 3000 tons of sugar. She will
commence discharging ballast on
Monday.

The Liverpool tug Blazer recently
went from her home port to Rio de
Janeiro, to tow thence to Genoa,
the disabled steamer Colombo, a
vessel of 2934 tons. On the way to
Genoa with her tow she had to call
in at three places for coal, making
the distance traveled about 5500
miles. From her starting point at
Liverpool to Genoa the tug travel-
ed over 11,000 miles. She eclipsed
all previous records, and won for
herself the honor of having success-
fully accomplished the longest
ocean tow on record.


