AFTER THE RAILROADS.

Why Sugar is Shipped via the Horn From Honolulu.

The Hawaiian sugar planters have commenced a crusade against the transcontinental railroads, says the San Francisco Bulletin. The planters hope to bring the railroads to terms, and are sure that they will win. The attitude of the sugar men explains the call for deep-water ships to take cargoes from Honolulu direct to New York, instead of shipping to San Francisco, then transshipping to the Atlantic Coast.

Shipowners were surprised some weeks ago to learn through the Bulletin that a large fleet of American and English ships had been chartered to load sugar for New York, and shortly afterward the American ships Tillie E. Starbuck and Manuel Llaguna sailed for Hawaii in ballast, under contract, to voyage with sweets around the Horn.

About twenty-two ships in all have been chartered, including a number of vessels of local register. The deal is in one sense of the word a good thing for the shipowners, but the port of San Francisco's receipts of sugar will be materially reduced.

Two large warehouses at Honolulu are filled with sugar for Eastern shipment, via the Cape.

The plan of the planters' campaign is outlined in a letter from the islands, which states that the planters have become tired of the exactions of the railroads, and have determined to bring the Transcontinental Association to terms. They believe that the transportation companies cannot afford to lose the sugar traffic, and will be forced to reduce the sugar schedule at least 35 per cent.

There is some talk about the Spreckels being back of the move, as it is alleged that the planters have several large capitalists at their back. The fight promises to be a long one.
