AT KAMEHAMEHA.
Commencement Exercises Draw Out a Large Crowd.
 The first day's program of commencement week at Kamehameha school attracted a large and interested gathering of the friends of that institution yesterday. The exercises proper were given by the Manual and Preparatory Schools in the gymnasium of the school and consisted of music, recitations, and singing.
 At the conclusion of the regular program an Indian club exhibition was given, followed by company and battalion drill and dress parade. At 2:30 p. m. this afternoon the regular class day exercises begin. In connection with this event there will be a baseball game between Kamehameha alumni and school teams; also the usual ceremony of ivy planting at Bishop Hall.
 In the evening there will be a reception to the graduating class at the home of Principal Richards.

An Able Preacher.

Rev. R. S. McArthur, pastor of the Calvary Baptist Church, New York city, preached at the Christian Church services in Harmony hall, King street, on Sunday evening. There was a large congregation present. The subject of discourse was the 4th chapter of John L., and Mr. McArthur spoke forty-five minutes. The hearers were delighted with the apt and clear illustrations and the splendid reading of the preacher. After returning from the volcano Mr. McArthur will preach again for the Christian Church.

Johnson Extradited.

Chief Justice Judd on Saturday rendered a decision and certificate to the Minister of Foreign Affairs, for the extradition of W. H. Johnson. Respondent, who was auditor of Muscatine county, Iowa, is under indictment by the grand jury of that county for forgery, in changing the endorsement on a draft for \$151.05. Mr. Neumann appeared for him and made an objection, which the Chief Justice over-ruled. Johnson was taken away by the Australia in custody of Sheriff Willey of Muscatine county.
