**FATHER DAMIEN OF HAWAII.**

Joseph de Veuster Damien was born in Belgium on January 3, 1840. He was educated in the Roman Catholic Seminary at Louvain, where there exists at the present day an institution for the supplying of missionaries to the lepers. Father Damien went out to the island of Molokai, Hawaii, where he ministered to the wants of the unfortunates separated by the terrible disease from the rest of the inhabited world. He himself fell a victim to the disease April 3, 1889, at the age of 49 years.
