

THE NEW WOMAN AS A TEXT.

Rev. W. A. Gardner's Effective Sermons.

Rev. W. A. Gardner of the West Side Christian Church preached a sermon on that most popular of all topics, "The New Woman," Sunday evening. In the course of it he said:

"Much of our current literature is full of reference to the 'new woman.' She is discussed, exhorted, ridiculed, condemned and praised. All sorts of ideas are entertained and prophecies made concerning this latest product of the nineteenth century. Some good people are shocked and alarmed at her costume. To them the bloomer is an index of the moral degeneracy of the times. It is within my recollection that the woman who dared enter society without the unsightly, unhealthy and, indeed, dangerous hoop-skirt, was reproached and criticised. Yet the hoop-skirt was as unnecessary to the demands of nature as the barbarous shoe worn by the Chinese lady. Is the same not true of any skirt? Woman is a biped, and has as much right to dress for health, convenience and comfort as her man. I have little uneasiness concerning this phase of the new woman."

Mr. Gardner then suggested a few characteristics of the new woman according to the Christ idea. "She will be one or equal with man as instructor in all our schools," he said. "Had the theological schools felt more the influence of woman, it is probable we should have had much more of that love which is the essence of Christianity and less of that dogmatic theology that has cursed the church. The new woman will also occupy our pulpits and tell the story of the cross with such power and pathos that the stubborn problem of converting the men will be solved. In the new church of the twentieth century, with its doors open seven days in the week, with its Christ-like ministry to sorrowing humanity, I shall not be surprised to know that the best officers and pastors are women, while the majority of those in the pews are men. Christ's new woman will be an equal partner with her husband in the control of their children and of their community property."

"She will no longer be the slave of taxation without representation, but will have an equal voice with the criminals who are now marched to the ballot box, where they, together with ignorant foreigners and drunken wretches, help to forge the chains that hold half our citizens in bondage. In account of her increased independence of character she will be as ready to free upon the uncleanliness and impurity of a man as she now does on that of a woman. She will compel the man upon whom she bestows her affection to have as clean a life and as pure a heart as he expects of her. It is my faith that in politics, in religion and in society the new woman will be a revolutionary influence; exciting, purifying and educating as it has been impossible for her to do with her past environment. May the Lord hasten her evolution."—S. F. Chronicle.
