The Colonial liner Warrimoo left for Sydney at 10 o'clock last night. The schooner Kaukaeoni is on the Marine Railway undergoing repairs.

The bark Motican anchored in naval row this morning from her cruise outside. The steamer Iwaleai brought 110 bags of Kekaha sugar in the morning, which is being unloaded in the Marine wharf.
