

SCHOONER ALOHA ARRIVES.

STEAMER KAHULUI ON HER WAY TO HONOLULU.

Steamer Kilauoa Hon Out-Kanal Goes to Makaweli- Foreign Shipping -Notes Alongshore Today.

The yacht Spray is cruising outside this afternoon. The schooner Volante arrived at Eureka, Nov 16, from Kahului. The bark Alden Besse sailed from Port Blakely Nov 14 for this port.


